Subject: Mobile Alliance against Child Sexual Abuse Content

An international group of mobile operators within the GSMA have recently founded the Mobile Alliance against Child Sexual Abuse Content to work together on obstructing the use of the mobile environment by individuals or organizations wishing to consume or profit from child sexual abuse content. This alliance has been welcomed and adopted by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) with distinctive membership of 191 member states and some 700 private companies.

As a member of the ITU, the TRA supports this initiative and advises you, if you are not already a member, to join this alliance. The TRA also urges you to take the following measures that the members of the alliance have decided to adopt, among others:

- Implement technical mechanisms to prevent access to Web sites identified by an appropriate agency as hosting child sexual abuse content;
- Implement Notice and take Down processes to enable the removal of any child sexual abuse content posted on their own services; and
- Support and promote 'hotlines' or other mechanisms for customers to report child sexual abuse content discovered on the Internet or on mobile content services.
