Former deputy PM to host the TelecomFinance 2009 Awards Ceremony

The TelecomFinance awards, honouring the top deals and banks of 2008, are to be presented by former British Deputy Prime Minister John Prescott.

Mr Prescott, Britain's longest serving Deputy Prime Minister and a key player in the Blair government, will present the awards at a gala dinner on the second day of the conference, on January 28.

For the deals of the year categories, the TelecomFinance editorial team selected a shortlist of the top transactions in three regions - Europe, the Middle East & Africa and Asia. Looking at both M&A and loans, the team endeavoured to reflect the main consolidation trends of 2008 as well as the increasingly difficult financial situation.
